A WORD FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

The year has started well and it is great to see how well many of our new students have settled into the routine of school and joined our community in such a positive way. I'm sure many families are keeping up with what is happening at Doxa through our Facebook page thanks to Colleen's great work in keeping things up to date.

As well as our new students we also have a new staff member in Peter Smith. He has joined our team to help out in all class groups by picking up roles to replace teachers as needed and to support students with one to one tutoring. He is an experienced teacher with much to offer our school and I would like to welcome him as he joins the Doxa family.

COVID is still an ongoing concern for us and the wider community. As a school we have specific requirements we need to follow, which include all staff having been fully vaccinated (3 doses), and all visitors to the school including parents and guardians being fully vaccinated as well. While some restrictions have been eased or lifted we are still doing our best to keep our community safe and well. Our cleaning and sanitising routines are continuing, and we are required to Rapid Antigen test twice weekly. We have already had a number of students and staff who have had to isolate themselves as household contacts, but fortunately, no one who has had COVID during the school year so far.

It has been pleasing to see our attendance levels have been healthy most days and I would certainly encourage all students to do their best to build their attendance.

Congratulations to those students who have started their VET studies at TAFE or are continuing on from last year. They are doing well. Thank you also to the staff members who attend with the students to support their learning at TAFE. Our experience over the past couple of years is that our VET students experience real success after they leave Doxa School as a result of the confidence they gain in participating in the VET program. It was fantastic to see that one of our past students Cody Newlan won the pre-apprentice of the year award at TAFE for his efforts last year, and there are a number of other past students who have found their passion and started a journey on a successful pathway into further study and work. Well done to all of them.

Thank you to all the families who have attended Individual Learning Plan (ILP) meetings this week and to those who will attend in the next couple of weeks. I really appreciate the incredible support our parents and carers provide to help your students and our staff in the work we do together to help our young people be the best they can be. Sometimes the journey through school can be a tough one and it is courageous of many of our students to face the challenges they do. I know that the staff here and the families that surround them want the best for them and it is important that we all work together to help them achieve success. Well done to our students for a positive start to 2022 and to our families for their ongoing support.
