We had a great time exploring the regions attractions and a day of snow play on Lake Mountain. All the students were fantastic and so supportive of each other.


Our class managed to complete their ILP meeting this term and work towards ticking off some goals. Keep doing your best.



## Introducing the VPC at Doxa

There are significant changes taking place in the Senior Certificate options from 2023. Next year, Doxa will be offering the VPC (Victorian Pathways Certificate) at years 10, 11 and 12, replacing VCAL. Students will also have the opportunity to complete their VETis certificates in Building and Construction, Automotive, Engineering, Allied Health, Animal Studies or Kitchen Operations (based on availability)

The purpose of the VPC is to:

- equip students with the skills, knowledge, values and capabilities to be active and informed citizens, lifelong learners and confident and creative individuals.
- empower students to make informed decisions about the next stages of their lives through authentic workplace experiences providing them with the best opportunity to achieve their personal goals and aspirations in a rapidly changing world.

For interested parents/carers we will be having an information session on early next term. We will advertise dates once confirmed.
