BRAD'S CLASS


What an adventure our first term has been! The majority of our group are new to Doxa, so we've been spending our time getting to know the way things are done at Doxa and building new connections in a new school.

3. What was your first job?

At 14 years old delivered accounts for a servo on his bike, got paid 5c for every letter because stamps cost 10c. When he was 15 years old he worked in his Dads factory.

4. When did you become a youth worker and why?

After high school I went to Uni and studied Science then worked in a factory for 2 years and was doing volunteer work as well. Family and friends talked to me and I went back to study to give young people a chance and make the world a better place.

1980-41 years ago, went back to college and studied Youth Work. Started working in 1983 doing street work, lots of other jobs, AoD, Justice, Homelessness and Policy development.

5. When did you start at Doxa?

2015 after working at TAFE for about 6 years.
