Term 3 VET Hospitality Report

As Term 3 comes to a close, the Hospitality students have been finishing off their Basic Methods of Cookery unit. They have worked towards this unit for 8 weeks, cooking and presenting beautiful dishes using steaming, poaching, braising, baking, stewing, deep-frying & grilling.


Over 2 weeks, students spent Hospitality days at Marist College Bendigo, who kindly allowed us to use their kitchen for our assessment days. Students had to plan their time in the kitchen and work to industry standards to cook and present dishes within set timeframes. On their first day in the kitchen we cooked Mushroom Spaetzle, Steamed chicken and Vegetables, Rice Pilaf and Tempura Vegetables. On their second assessment day, they were much more comfortable in the kitchen and made Steak with Mediterranean Vegetables and Potatoes, Baked Egg Custard with stewed apples, vanilla cream and toffee almonds and Poached Pears with almonds and chocolate sauce.

In the week after the assessment days, students went to a local food venue to eat dishes similar to those they had cooked during their assessment and were able to discuss some of the challenges cooking all of these dishes at once would have presented in a commercial environment and the methods of cookery used for the dishes ordered.

All of the Hospitality students should be very proud of their accomplishments over the term, meeting the requirements for the units in a way that enabled genuine learning and provided great experience in commercial kitchens.

We wish all our families a happy and safe terms break and look forward to seeing everyone refreshed and ready to finish the year strongly in term 4.
