A WORD FROM OUR DRINCIPAL

Welcome back to semester 2 and the 'winter' term, as well as a time of uncertainty regarding COVID 19. The term has started well for most of us although there have been a few staff members and students who have been a little unwell. I have been pleased to see that staff and students are staying home if they are unwell and not spreading sickness through the school. This does mean we are having some slightly higher absences, but, it also helps to keep us well.

We will be continuing to operate the school program as we did in the second half of term 2 with lots of washing and sanitising of hands, temperature checks and appropriate use of protective equipment. Student transport in our buses is still limited though we are thinking creatively about how we can participate in some off-site activities in outdoor areas away from the school. 

SHED WITH JACKO


This term in Shed we have started to work on simple electrical circuits. We are looking at what electricity is and how it is applied in day to day living. After some basic circuits we are currently making a small Dragster. It has a small electric motor that drives a gear and pinion direct to the axle. This involves a basic circuit that has a battery pack and a switch that needs to be soldered and gives our students the chance to explore and develop another skill. Students will get the chance to race their Dragster and look at gear ratio, acceleration and speed.

LOU'S CLASS


