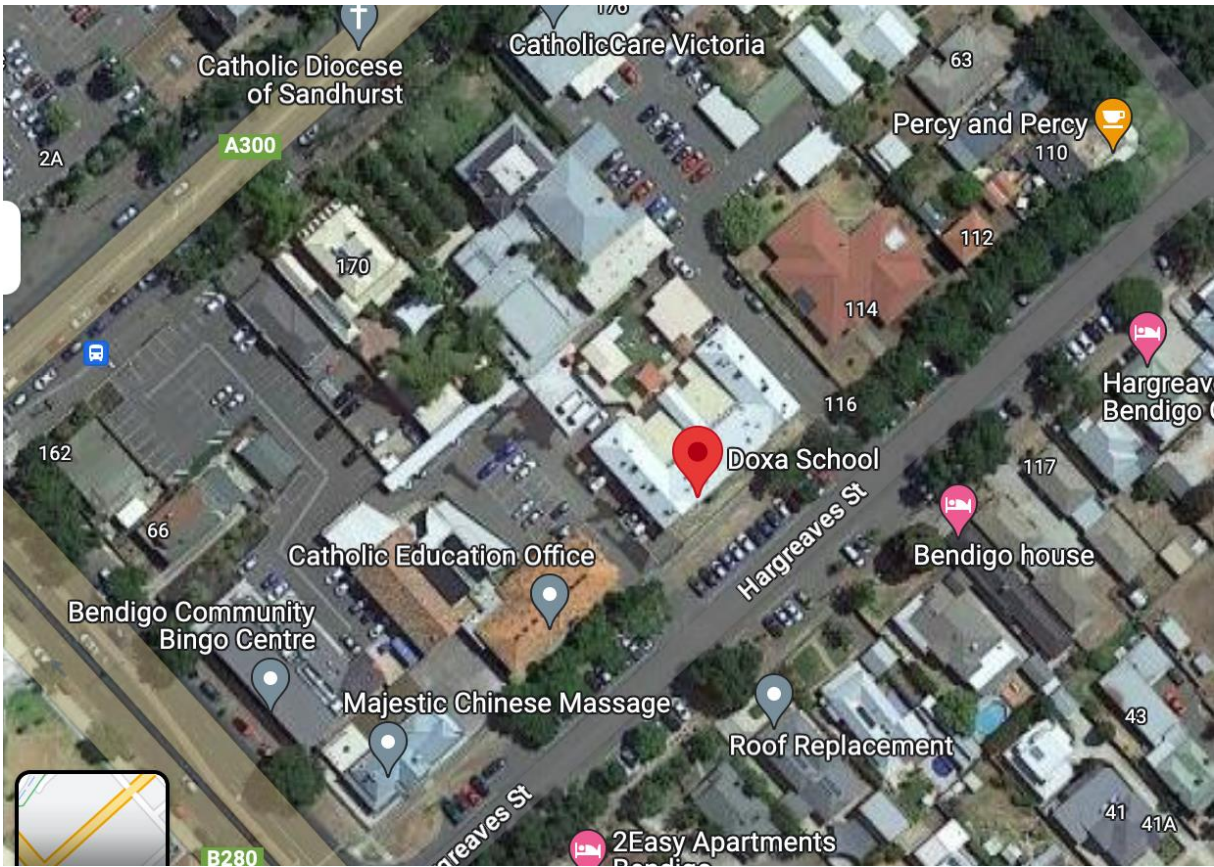

General Information

Student Absences:

If your child is ill or unable to attend school, it is important that you contact the school office to inform the school.

This can be done through the office phone (5442 8140), the school mobile (0417 108 870), or through the school Facebook page.

Please ensure your message is clear as to who is absent. If the school has not been contacted by 10am our Administration Officer will contact parents/carers to clarify the student's absence.

Sign in/ Out:

All visitors to the school as well as students who enter or leave the school outside of normal times are required to sign in or out as appropriate. This is done through the iPad in the entry foyer or by the Administration Officer through the SIMON Kiosk. Parents/ Guardians who wish to exit their child early should contact the School Office to confirm this and sign their child out or give permission for the student to leave under specific circumstances.

Food Provisions:

Doxa School doesn't have a canteen however we provide a daily light breakfast and morning tea, as well as lunch on a regular basis. We encourage students to bring their own lunch and snacks to school, there are always snacks and fruit available as we do our best to ensure our students do not go hungry.

Complaint Procedure:

Doxa School Bendigo is a Child Safe community committed to providing an environment that is true to the values of our schoolwide expectations: being Safe, Kind and Curious. We promote care for all individuals in the school community and this is reflected in our support of students to learn to understand and regulate their own behaviour.

All Doxa School Bendigo's policy and procedural documentation is underpinned by our 5 key Pillars of the Doxa School Model: Student-Centred Approach, Trauma Sensitive Practice, Social and Literacy, Choice Theory and our Catholic Identity and complies with the requirements of Catholic Education Sandhurst Ltd. This Policy can be found on our school website www.doxabendigo.catholic.edu.au and applies to all community members of Doxa School Bendigo.

Phone Policy:

Students at Doxa School Bendigo will be required to keep their mobile phones and other personal digital devices switched to silent and out of sight during all class sessions. This includes afternoon program

The rationale behind this policy is based around research in neuroscience and the development of social behaviours in young people. Studies have shown that excessive use of personal digital devices, including mobile phones and wearable devices, can negatively impact young people's cognitive development, attention span and social skills. By limiting access to these devices during school hours we aim to:

1. Enhance Focus and Learning
2. Promote Social Interaction
3. Support Mental Health

We request that all contact goes through the school staff. Should you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact us.

Immunisations:

Each year Doxa school organises immunisations through Bendigo Community Health as a support for families in keeping our young people up to date with all immunisation requirements. Information regarding immunisations will be posted on our website, in newsletters and on our Facebook page when they are coming up.

Newsletters:

School newsletters are produced regularly and are sent to families via email, the school website and through Facebook. They are a great way of keeping up to date with what is happening in the Doxa School community.

Reporting Student Progress:

Each term families are invited to attend Individual Learning Plan (ILP) meetings. These meetings are an important opportunity for carers to participate in discussions addressing their young person's goals and learning progress.

Each semester a formal written report is presented to families. It is the habit of our teaching and wellbeing staff to contact the families of our students often during the term, providing informal opportunities for information regarding student progress to be reported on regularly.

Public Transport/ Conveyance Allowance:

Doxa School is a specialist setting enabling students to travel by public or school bus transport past other schools to attend and still be eligible for the conveyance allowance. The school is to support families who are eligible for supported transport to and from school and this information will be provided to families on enrolment.

We have students who travel from a variety of places throughout Central Victoria, using school buses, public buses and trains. Whatever your families' requirements may be regarding transport to and from school, please contact the school to seek support if needed.

Afternoon Program:

Doxa School provides an afternoon program that offers opportunities for students to participate in a variety of activities that may include; art and craft activities, sport, gym, bike riding, computer games, board games, outdoor activities, shed, music and cooking. The activities are conducted in small groups and may be undertaken on or offsite depending on the activity. Afternoon program provides an opportunity for students to interact with a range of students, engage with the community and provide learning environments that encourage engagement and different experiences.

Camps, Incursions and Excursions:

Doxa School provides opportunities for all students to participate in learning experiences via incursions, excursions and camps. We offer a range of activities to cater for the various needs of our students. Incursions and excursions are experiential learning activities that are provided onsite, locally or within a manageable travel distance. Incursions may include visiting speakers, wildlife exhibits, artists and others. Excursions may include theatre trips, football or other sport experiences and various activities in Melbourne and other centres.

The school offers an overnight camp program that endeavours to cater for a range of student abilities to participate. Camps can range from 1 to 3 overnight stays and may be interstate, regional or local with a focus on providing opportunities that allow as many students as possible to join to the best of their ability.

All camps and excursions are free of any costs to families.

Family Engagement:

Doxa School values our all our relationships, particularly with our families, parents and carers. This partnership is crucial in the support we provide together for our students. Our community prides itself on being a welcoming one that is safe for all those connected to us. We provide a range of opportunities for

families to join us in supporting their students learning, social and emotional growth, and in celebrating their successes.

As well as formal meetings we conduct family morning teas, when open parents and carers are welcome to visit our Doxa Café, and we love to see families support their students at our annual awards evening in December.

Child Safeguarding

Doxa School Bendigo provides a child-safe environment, where all students have the right to be treated with respect and dignity, and will be protected from harm. The well-being of children in our care will always be our priority and we have zero tolerance to child abuse. Any allegations and safety concerns will be treated seriously and consistently with our policies and procedures.
